Franklin, Oxford, and Androscoggin Counties:

If a person has MaineCare, then they can call Penquis CAP (1-844-736-7847) which is the broker for these rides, and it will get assigned to our KV Van program (which could include a van, volunteer, or taxi ride.)

If a person already receives KV Van Services through another source (usually DHHS low-income grant), call 859-1500 or 1-800-542-8227 to book the ride.

Our Explorer buses are currently operating under a Demand Response model. To book a ride in one of the 3 major hub areas, call 859-1500 or 1-800-542-8227 and ask for Explorer in Waterville, Augusta or Skowhegan.
