

Oral Mucosal Disease: A Field Guide for the Oral Healthcare Provider

(6 Category 1 credits for Maine licensure)

This course will review oral mucosal disease including potentially malignant/malignant disorders. The seminar will be presented in a case-based learning format, and will focus on the latest in the diagnosis and treatment of those disorders. Since the oral condition often reflects systemic disease, Dr. Sollecito will discuss systemic concerns in relation to oral findings. Audience participation during the seminar will be encouraged to ensure an engaging/interactive presentation.

Learning Objectives: Attendees will

- Be able to evaluate the oral cavity and diagnose oral mucosal disease and potentially malignant conditions/oral cancer
- Understand the relationship between systemic disease and its oral manifestations
- Better manage those oral conditions with the latest therapeutics
- Be able to counsel patients regarding their oral condition

Dr. Thomas Peter Sollecito is a professor and the chair of oral medicine at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine and professor of oral medicine in otolaryngology: head and neck surgery at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. He is also an attending in oral medicine at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania and a university associate at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He completed his DMD degree program at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine, where he graduated with honors. He is a fellow in hospital dentistry, a diplomate in special care dentistry, and a diplomate in oral medicine. Formerly, he was the director of the Oral Medicine Residency Program and served as the interim dean at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine. He served as president of the Eta Chapter of OKU and president of the American Academy of Oral Medicine. He is a section editor of the Compendium Journal, he is a reviewer for the Journal of the American Dental Association, and is presently serving on the ADA Council of Scientific Affairs. He has authored numerous papers and chapters related to various topics in oral medicine.

Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office Course Objectives:

- How to recognize signs and symptoms of an emerging preoperative, perioperative and postoperative complication in the health care setting
 - How to be able to identify patients that may be at increased risk for a potential complication
 - How to establish a timely response to stabilize the patient after calling emergency medical services

 - Emergency care of patients with dental trauma
 - Complications associated with dentoalveolar injuries

Dr. Peter Vellis attended Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons, graduating in 2000 a doctor of dental surgery degree. He was commissioned in the United States Navy Dental Corps as a lieutenant and completed a general practice residency at Great Lakes Naval Hospital in Illinois. He completed a two-year tour as dental department head on the USS Detroit in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Dr. Vellis completed an advanced education training program in oral and maxillofacial surgery at the University of Minnesota in 2007, after which he served as the oral surgeon on the USS Dwight D Eisenhower. He deployed once again in support of combat operations. In 2009, he was assigned as head of the department of oral and maxillofacial surgery at the largest Naval dental clinic in the world in Norfolk, Va. His assignment also included a staff appointment at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, where he was involved in resident education. He was then selected to the rank of commander prior to his honorable discharge from the US Navy. Dr. Vellis joined New England Oral Surgery Associates in 2011.

Managing Dental Conditions of a “Boomer” Generation/Successful Tactics in Managing Peri-Implant Diseases

(6 Category 1 credits for Maine licensure)

This course will cover two topics in separate three-hour blocks.

Managing Dental Conditions of a “Boomer” Generation: The over-sixty population will increase significantly during the next decade, and with that comes an increased frequency of oral conditions associated with the “Baby Boomer Generation.”

Managing Dental Conditions of a “Boomer Generation” Course Objectives: Attendees will learn

- How to standardize the collection of periodontal data in an efficient manner, and review successful parameters to determine tooth survival in short and long-term prognosis
- How to develop “realistic” non-surgical therapies and the respective re-evaluation
- The etiology of xerostomia, from medications to Sjogren’s Syndrome
- How to create management strategies for “dry mouth,” and appreciate oral conditions that result
- How to establish techniques to communicate with the “Boomer Generation”

Successful Tactics in Managing Peri-Implant Diseases: The introduction of the dental implant to the overall management of the patient is at an all-time high and the standard of care. Recent data demonstrates that inflammation associated with the implant is commonplace and can result in loss of the implant, with failure rates continuing to be at an all-time high. Long-term implant success can depend on quality prevention, treatment, and maintenance.

Successful Tactics in Managing Peri-Implant Diseases Course Objectives: Attendees will learn

- How to enhance diagnostic skills for implantitis versus mucositis, and how to script patient explanations
- How to consider local versus systemic antibiotics in detoxification/decontamination
- How to create innovative at-home oral hygiene systems that enhance compliance
- How to establish the role of dental lasers in both open and closed procedures
- How to determine the prognosis of an implantitis implant, and the ultimate treatment plan



Dr. Samuel Low is Professor Emeritus at the University of Florida College of Dentistry, is an associate faculty member of the Pankey Institute, and has 30 years of private practice experience in periodontics, lasers, and implant placement. He is also a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology and Past President of the American Academy of Periodontology. He sits on the Board of Directors of the Academy of Laser Dentistry. Dr. Low was selected “Dentist of the Year” by the Florida Dental Association, Distinguished Alumnus by the University of Texas Dental School, and has received the Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition Award. He is a Past President of the Florida Dental Association and past ADA Trustee.

Autism and Strategies for the Dental Practitioner/ Silver Products and Non-Surgical Management of Caries - the Old, the New, and the Ugly

This course will have one three-hour session (Autism and Strategies for the Dental Practitioner) in the morning, and one three-hour session (Silver Products and Non-Surgical Management of Caries) in the afternoon. **Autism and Strategies for the Dental Practitioner** will include a 90-minute lecture, followed by a panel discussion with parents and a pediatric dentist.

Autism and Strategies for the Dental Practitioner Course Objectives: Attendees will learn

- Information about what autism is, how to diagnose it, signs and symptoms of autism, and general strategies
- Environmental, sensory, communication, social skill, and behavioral strategies
- How to identify ways to decrease anxiety and stress with the individual and have a basic understanding of what triggers some behaviors

Silver Products and Non-Surgical Management of Caries Course Objectives: Attendees will

- Be familiar with the different types of topical silver products currently on the market, including their purported mechanisms of action in caries management
- Be familiar with the indications, contraindications, and clinical application of silver diamine fluoride
- Understand the scientific evidence supporting the non-surgical caries management approaches and recommendations for their use



Cathy Dionne is executive director of the Autism Society of Maine. She is a parent of a 24-year-old son with autism, who was diagnosed at the age of 18 months, and a 26-year-old daughter. She became involved with the Autism Society of Maine in 1996, first as a member of the Board of Directors, and then became vice president. Cathy then became a staff member of the Autism Society of Maine. She has now been with ASM for 21 years, during which she has been responsible for developing ASM's fundraising efforts. Her other accomplishments include initiating camp programs at the University of Farmington and in Biddeford, and organizing the annual Autism Family Retreat Weekend.



Dr. J. Timothy Wright received his DDS degree from West Virginia University, and completed his specialty training in pediatric dentistry at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He currently is the Distinguished Bawden Professor in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry, The University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and has served as Pediatric Dentistry Department chair. He is a Diplomat of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry and a Fellow of the American Academy for the Advancement of Science. He has published over 200 peer-reviewed scientific manuscripts, edited two texts, and authored 24 text chapters. Dr. Wright has served as the chair of the Council for Scientific Affairs for the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry and the American Dental Association. He is currently president-elect of the American Association for Dental Research.



Opioid Abuse, Appropriate Opioid Prescribing, Alcohol, and Marijuana and Their Impact On You, Your Family, and Your Dental Practice

(6 Category 1 credits for Maine licensure)

Harold Crossley, DDS, MS, Ph.D.

This program will have two parts, on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. The first half will discuss the addictive nature, abuse, and proper prescribing of opioids in a dental practice. For centuries, opioids have been used to control pain and suffering, but at what cost to us, our families, and our dental practices? What are our alternatives for controlling post-operative pain? This section will uncover fascinating details regarding the origins and influence of alcohol and its significant effect on our society today. The second half of the course will be devoted to marijuana. Twenty-three states have legalized marijuana for medical use. Nine states (including Maine) and the District of Columbia have legalized marijuana for recreational purposes. Inevitably, some of these marijuana users will be treated by the dentist or hygienist. What is it? Does it have any medicinal use? Is marijuana addicting? What are the effects of marijuana on driving ability? What are the effects of marijuana on intellectual development? What are "shatter," "wax," "dab," or "scat," and how do they differ? Is edible marijuana as effective as smoking or vaping? The second half of the presentation will discuss some of the concerns about marijuana use/abuse, and its bearing on dental treatment.

Learning Objectives: Attendees will learn

- Appropriate clinical use of the opioid and non-opioid analgesics
- The difference between the synthetic and natural forms of "the big three"
- How these drugs have been useful in the past but are abused today
- The medicinal and recreational effects of these drugs on the body systems
- The physical characteristics of marijuana
- Differences between edible, vaping, and smoking marijuana
- The meaning of "shatter," "dab," "wax," and "scat"

Dr. Harold Crossley is Professor Emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, Dr. Crossley received a bachelor of science degree in pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. He later

was awarded a masters and doctorate degrees in pharmacology. The University of Maryland Dental School awarded him a DDS degree in 1980. The liaison between the classroom and his part-time dental practice produced a practical approach to understanding the pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office. Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books, dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee, is an active member of Phi Kappa Phi, Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honorary Dental Society, the American College of Dentists, International College of Dentists, and an honorary member of the Thomas B. Hinman Dental Society. He was the recipient of the 2008 Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition Award and the recipient of the 2012 Award of Distinction presented by the Academy of Dentistry International for his efforts in continuing dental education. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974. Drawing on this unique background, Dr. Crossley has become nationally and internationally recognized as an expert on street drugs and chemical dependency as well as the clinical pharmacology of dental drugs.

The first half of Dr. Crossley's course will satisfy Maine's three-hour opioid education requirement every two years for dentists.
